The main objective of this proposal is to obtain the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE), which will enable our institution to participate fully in the Erasmus+ Programme and contribute to its overarching goals of enhancing quality in higher education, promoting international cooperation, and fostering innovation. By aligning our institutional strategies with the principles of ECHE, we aim to enhance the quality and relevance of education, strengthen international cooperation, and improve access to mobility opportunities for all students and staff.

Summary of criterion 1

The applicant's Erasmus Policy Statement (EPS) is clear and consistent, aligning well with the institution's profile. It effectively incorporates the importance of the Erasmus+ Programme and European higher education policy priorities into the institution's internationalisation and modernisation strategy. The EPS also includes adequate indicators, as well as targets and a timeline for implementation.

Summary of criterion 2

The applicant demonstrates strong and sustainable management for both administrative and academic structures, with a clear commitment to quality, reflected in the comprehensively explained monitoring and quality assurance procedures. The communication strategy for promoting the Erasmus+ programme, targeting specific groups, and selecting dissemination channels is well-described. Web links to an institutional page with contact information for the institution's international office and to the page where the ECHE and EPS will be published have been provided.

Criterion 3 - Implementation of the ECHE principles

Summary of criterion 3

Regarding the ECHE fundamental principles, the application outlines well defined measures for non-discrimination, transparency, and inclusion of students and staff. The institution's ECTS credit allocation methodology is adequately explained. There's a commitment to implementing the European Student Card Initiative and promoting the Erasmus+ Mobile App. Adequate environmentally friendly practices are described and relevant measures to encourage civic engagement are presented.

With regard to mobility activities, the applicant ensures the availability of the Course Catalogue, providing quick access and clear and complete information. The institution's approach to inter-institutional agreements for study and teaching mobility, management of learning agreements, preparation for outgoing students /staff, mentoring and support arrangements for incoming individuals is well-described. The application also covers measures for full automatic recognition and outlines procedures for recognising staff mobility.

Concerning cooperation projects, the application outlines the institution's strategy for promoting Erasmus+ cooperation projects and details plans to acknowledge staff and student involvement in these initiatives.

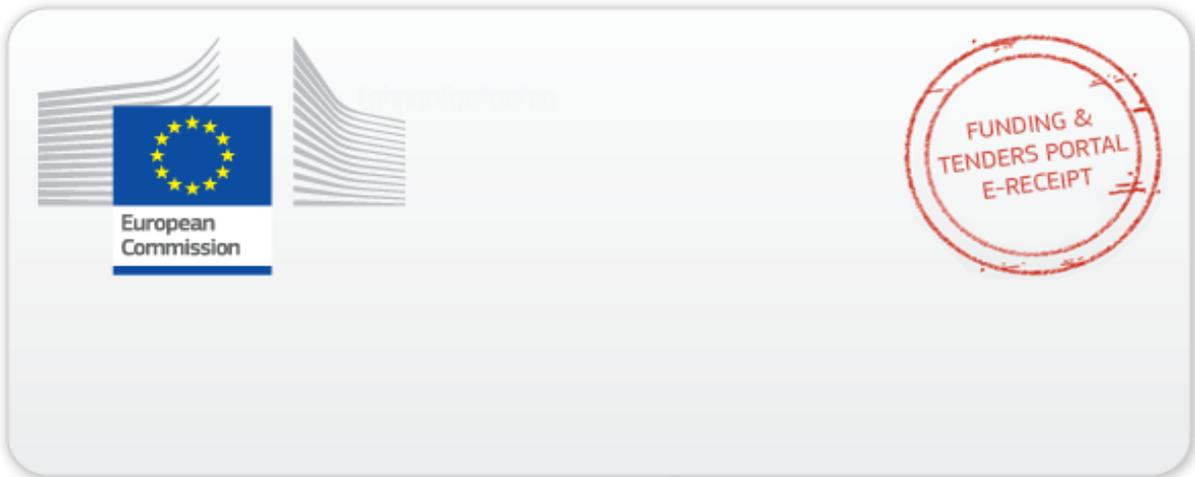
